VOTER INFORMATION

Voting Requirements

You are eligible to register and vote if you are a United States citizen, at least 18 years of age by the day of the election, and a resident of Washington State, provided you are not disqualified due to a court order nor under Department of Corrections supervision for a felony conviction.

Voting Registration

You may obtain a mail-in registration form at the Spokane County Elections Office, all State offices, all City clerks, the Department of Motor Vehicles, staffed fire stations, schools and libraries or get a printable registration form on-line at www.sos.wa.gov/elections/myvote. You must register by mail at least 29 days before an election. You may register in person at the Elections Office up to 8 days before an election. Office Hours: M-F 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Change of Registration

Change of name or address, even within the same precinct, will make it necessary for you to change your voter registration. Contact the Spokane County Election office at 477-2320 for information about that procedure or simply submit a new voter registration form. Changes to voter registration must be completed **29 days before** an election or you may not be able to vote in that election.

Vote-by-Mail Ballots

Spokane County is a vote-by-mail county for all elections. All ballots are mailed to registered voters 18 days prior to the election. Mark the ballot, sign the affidavit on the back of the envelope, and return;

Mail: Ballots must be postmarked no later than Election Day. First class postage required.

Official Elections Office Drop Boxes; Deliver to boxes at most public libraries throughout Spokane County and downtown Spokane Transit Authority Plaza. No postage is required. Not all drop boxes are open for every election. Please check ballot for available boxes for the current election. Boxes appropriate for each election will be open starting 20 days before the election until 8 p.m. Election night. Ballots will be collected regularly from the drop boxes.

County Elections Office; 1033 W. Gardner Ave-deliver any time before 8 p.m. Election Night. A drop box is on Gardner Ave.

Voter Service Centers; Available on Election Day only from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. – call Elections Office (477-2320) or go to www.spo-kanecounty.org/elections for locations. Services available for those who have spoiled their ballot, need replacement envelopes, need to vote a provisional ballot, want to drop-off their ballot instead of mailing it or those needing special assistance. Each Center has a Disability Accessibility Voting Unit (DAU) for those who need help in filling out their ballot, such as persons with limited eye sight or dexterity or those with cognitive disabilities.
